Overview:

Developed by Lean Sensei International, all participants will build a more comprehensive knowledge of the best lean tools. With the support, they will:

- Implement lean improvements through team building and hands-on blitzes
- Identify opportunities for process improvement and cost reduction through application of lean philosophy
- Provide continuous guidance for lean implementation through coaching, brainstorming and leading
- Learn to challenge the status quo and facilitate out-of-box thinking
- Respond to various issues and questions around Lean Programs

Objectives:

Building on the Level I program, the primary focus of the Level II is on practical application, facilitation, coaching and lean project management skills. Participants also work at addressing the “soft-issues” including understanding people, working with teams, motivation and becoming a lean facilitator within an organization. Each participant will learn to become a trainer through the modules and will have an opportunity to develop his or her own training materials.
